Thanksgiving Everyday

"It is good to give thanks to the Lord, And to sing praises to Your name, O Most High; To declare Your lovingkindness in the morning, and Your faithfulness every night" — (Psalm 92:1-2).

The psalmist declares, "It is good to give thanks to the Lord." It is a blessing that our country has seen the need to set aside a day to thank God. Today, one may observe many things that would cause one to wonder, "Does anyone even believe in God?" However, the founding fathers of this nation believed in God, and they were not ashamed to express their faith and thanksgiving to Him. Indeed, there is a great need to return to a profound recognition of God, who He is, and what He has done for us. In the sermon on the mount, Jesus tells the multitudes listening not to worry (Matthew 6:25-34). In this short section, Jesus will say to the audience not to worry or the equivalent six times. Jesus told them not to worry about what they would eat, drink, or their clothing. Jesus explains to them that God takes care of His creation and will not forget about us. Is Jesus teaching that one should do nothing and the bread from heaven will come? No! The point is do not worry and put God first. "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you" (Matthew 6:33). Jesus reminds them to put God's rule, reign, or dominion first. In doing this, one will be able to have the things that he needs. God will provide, and we need to be thankful when He provides. How often do you have the needs of life met? We must remember to thank God for blessing us with those needs.

Thankful For the Grace of God

Often, thanksgiving is equated with the physical blessings that we are blessed to enjoy. However, we should never overlook the spiritual blessings

God has blessed us with. Paul wrote, "The grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men" (Titus 2:11). Living daily, it is possible to get caught up on life's negative things and frustrations. Some people seem to love living in this realm, but Jesus came to bring joy to our lives. The joy is having the forgiveness of sins, the hope of salvation, and peace with God. As the people of God, we should remember why life can be a joy in all things: because of the grace God has extended to us.

Thankful For Others and Serving

When God created man in the Garden of Eden, He looked and saw that man needed companionship. He created a woman for Adam, which began the association of family and friends for man. In life, countless people are helping to make your life what it is. God is the giver of all things, but man uses his talents and abilities for food to be on the table to eat, clothes for us to wear, and many other things that are made possible by the work and diligence of others to bring these things to pass.
